



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CROATIAN CHAMBER OF ECONOMY AND JORDAN EUROPE BUSINESS ASSOCIATION (JEBA)

The Croatian Chamber of Economy and Jordan Europe Business Association (hereinafter referred to as "The Parties") – having taken into account the common aspiration of the business circles in both countries, and in order to develop mutually beneficial relations – have agreed on the following, within the limits of the law of their respective countries:

Article I

The Parties shall be co-operative and do their utmost to further improve and expand trade between the Republic of Croatia and the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan.

Article II

The Parties shall regularly exchange information and views on expansion of trade between the two countries. To achieve this objective, it is mutually agreed that each contracting party shall supply the other with trade information and publications.

Article III

The Parties shall encourage, support, and facilitate trade missions from the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan visiting the Republic of Croatia and vice versa, as well as individual or group visits by businessmen between the two countries.

Article IV

The Parties shall assist each other in the organization of and participation in trade exhibitions, fairs and symposia or similar events within their respective competence.

Article V

The Parties shall make every effort to provide assistance in resolving problems that affect trade between the Republic of Croatia and the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan.

Article VI

The Parties shall take all necessary steps to ensure that the Memorandum of Understanding works to their mutual benefit, and that it is jointly reviewed from time to time.

Article VII

The Memorandum of Understanding shall come into force as from its date of signing and shall be valid until mutually revised by both parties.
